
ABSTRACTS

Abstract should not exceed 250 words and be submitted in English.

Please indicate which theme(s) your abstract(s) should be categorized in, and if it is intended for a poster or oral presentation. *If space becomes limited, the organizers reserve the rights to determine whether a paper will be presented orally or as a poster.*

Abstracts must be succinct and include the following: hypothesis, why the research was important, methodology, results, discussion and conclusion. The abstract is often the only part of the paper to be read, so make sure to include your major findings in a useful and concise manner. Include a problem statement, objectives, brief methods, quantitative results, and the significance of your findings. In addition, please provide a maximum of ten keywords separated by commas (specific and general terms that will aid in searches).

The following presents the general layout of abstracts for submission.



August 12 – 16, 2007

The body of the abstract must not exceed 250 words. Recently, sea buckthorn has been recommended for orchard-type cultivation in British Columbia and the prairie provinces. Sea buckthorn normally is transplanted or directly seeded in the spring. It grows best in deep, well drained, sandy loam soil with ample organic matter. In arid or semiarid areas, water must be supplied for establishment. Soil acidity and alkalinity, except at extreme levels, are not limiting factors, although it thrives best at pH 6 to 7... The body of the abstract must not exceed 250 words.

Keywords: provide up to 10 keywords.

DEADLINES FOR SUBMISSION

Abstracts

Abstracts should be submitted by e-mail to <u>ISA2007.abstracts@inaf.ulaval.ca</u> **no later than March 31, 2007.** Notification of acceptance will be sent to authors no later than May 18, 2007.

Full Papers

Authors whose abstracts have been accepted may submit a full article for publication in the ISA 2007 Conference proceedings. In order to be published, full papers must be written in a formal scientific style and comply with all guidelines provided (next page). Full papers must arrive at the ISA 2007 Secretariat no later than **July 13, 2007**. Additional instructions will be provided to authors upon acceptance of abstracts.

Notes for submitting abstracts and full paper manuscripts

- 1) Abstracts and manuscripts should be prepared in English, paper format is A4 (210 mm x 290 mm) or equivalent.
 - a. Abstract should not exceed 250 words.
 - b. Full paper should not exceed 10 pages, figures and tables included.
- 2) Microsoft Word formats are recommended for preparation of abstracts and manuscripts.
- 3) The adopted font is Times New Roman.
- 4) Title is in font size of 16 for papers, 14 for abstracts, bold black, centered and single spaced lines.
- 5) Name of authors is in font size of 10.5, centered (single spaced). Leave a double space between the authors and the organization.
- 6) Organization and address (e-mail) should be in full name, in font size of 10 (single spaced). Leave double space between the organization and the text.
- 7) Text of abstract and full paper is in size of 10 (single spaced line).

- Keywords are lined out in English with 6 to 10 words at maximum. Leave double space between the end of the text and keywords.
- 9) First title level of the paper is in font size of 10, bold black and with two blank lines above and below the line. Other title levels start on a new line.
- 10) Figures, photographs and tables are edited and inserted into main text at proper places.
- Title of tables is in font size of 10 and typed on top of the table, bold black and centered; words in tables are in font size of 10. Tables are numbered with Arabic numerals.
- 12) Figure caption is in font size of 10, placed below the figure and left-aligned.
- 13) References must be included in full papers only.
- 14) Format of reference: author (use comma to separate more than two authors), year of publishing, title of journal (full title in italics), Volume (issue, number), first page-last page. See examples below.

Oral Presentations

Oral presentations must be prepared in Microsoft Powerpoint format. Duration of presentation and preliminary schedule will be provided in May 2007.

Poster Presentations

Each poster presentation should include:

- 1) Title
- 2) Name of authors
- 3) Abstract
- 4) Subject, i.e. research objective
- 5) Experimental materials and methodology
- 6) Key conclusions
- 7) Major references
- 8) Total poster dimension should not exceed 90 cm high by 120 cm wide. Posters will be mounted on boards for displaying.
