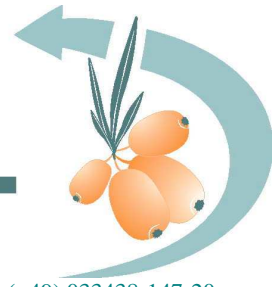

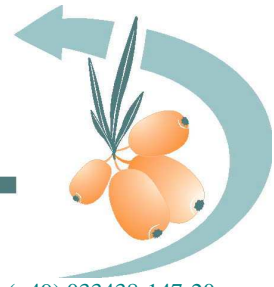

by foot to railway station (5 minutes)

you have two options

a)

take regional train to Berlin center (every 20 minutes)

change at station Alexanderplatz

to city train S 7 direction Potsdam (every 10 minutes)

b)

take regional train to Potsdam (every hour)

Leave at junction Michendorf, take B2 direction Potsdam,

after 13 km leave right in Dortustraße

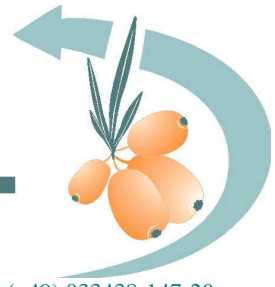

sketch-map



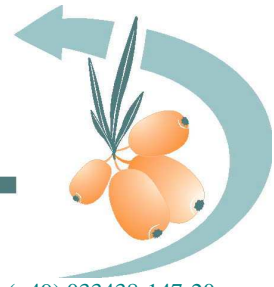
1 Conference venue

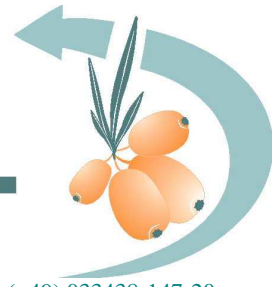

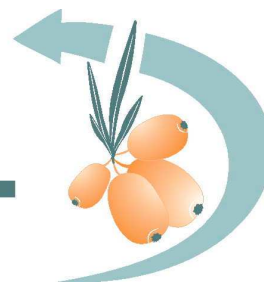

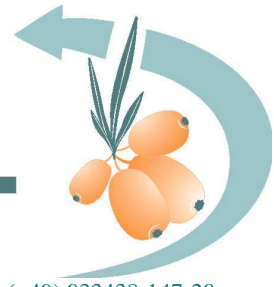
